- 1. The scholarship application is available to any US citizen or permanent resident over the age of 18 who meets the scholarship and US Nanny Institute program requirements. Applicants should plan to continue in a childcare related field.
- 2. The amount and number of scholarships is established by the amount donated to this scholarship fund and is not recurring.
- 3. All applications, essays, and supportive material must be legible (ideally typed), grammatically correct and complete for acceptance and review for the scholarship.'
- 4. The Scholarship application form must be received prior to the application deadline.
- 5. All applications must be submitted to info@usnannyinstitute.com. A confirmation email receipt will be provided to the email address that submitted the application. If the applicant does not receive a confirmation receipt within 3 business days, email or call 941-773-9020.
- 6. The Scholarship review committee will make the final decision on the selected scholarship recipient within 45 days of the scholarship application deadline.

5	Excellent	Essay communicates a foundational knowledge of childcare, a childcare career, service, leadership, high moral character, emotional maturity, responsibility, professionalism, and/or accountability
